The wine will remain a "mystery" until presented, and cherry-picking from the Bin is not allowed. As an indication of the level of caliber of the Bin wines here are a few examples of the goodies we found recently: Freemark Abbey Bousche, Silver Oak, and Hess Collection.

MEAT MARKET

If there were any cardinal rules in our "Meats and Potatoes" business, the phrase "Steak goes best with Cabernet" would probably be one of them. This may have been true when our founder, Alan Stillman opened Smith & Wollensky in the 1970's, when his cellar might be limited by what was available in the market back then. However, much has happened in the world of wine since then. So this begs the question:

Is this Steak=Cab rule still the golden rule?

In this section named "Meat Market," our team had hand-picked a short but diverse list of wines out of the Cabernet domain, which we believe will go well with steak. So are you ready to drop its traditional partner, and find a new mate to tango with your steak tonight?

Tinto Pesquera 2008 Ribera Del Duero, Spain 68

Although wine production in Ribera del Duero consisted of simple rosé wines and garnacha, the region did not receive much attention until the '70s, when Alejandro Fernandez founded his bodega Pesquera and started to make red wines from Tempranillo in a more concentrated, and fruit-driven style. This wine, well-received both in Spain and by many international wine critics practically put wines of this region on the map.

LeLuSi 2004 Aglianico del Vulture Basilicata, Italy 69

The name LeLuSi originated from the beginning of each of the siblings names – Letizia, Luca and Simona. Comparable to some of Italy's best reds, Aglianico is an important grape in the Campania and Basilicata region. With a rich texture and complex flavors, Aglianico is full bodied with firm tannins and pairs great with lamb.

Viader 2009 Cabernet Franc Napa 75

Impressed by the wines of Chateau Cheval Blanc, Delia Viader is always "daring to be different". With a leading hand from family friend Michael Rolland, the Viader estate is now ran by her four children and pet clan. Viader was also the winery that made the first ever Quality Wine, now on its third vintage.

Langtry 2007 Petit Sirah Guenoc Valley, California 77

Petite Sirah, a.k.a Petite Syrah or Durif, is historically referred to a small berried clone of the Syrah grape by Rhône growers. Langtry is one of California's leading producers of Petite Sirah in both volume and quality. Their namesake, Lillie Langtry, was a flamboyant British theatre star who purchased the property in 1888 producing wines portraying her likeness on the glass.

Grgic 2007 Plavic Mali Croatia 99

This is the "home project" of Napa's Grgich Hill Estates, whose founder Miljenko "Mike" Grgich hails from Croatia. It was Mike that first recognized the potential lineage between Zinfandel and his native Plavic Mali grape, which had since been scientifically proven.

Jean Luc Colombo 2005 "Terres Brûlées" Cornas, Rhone 109

A native of Marseilles, Colombo first developed a strong admiration for the wines of the Rhone Valley in the late 1970s as a pharmacy student. A devotee of the Syrah grape, Colombo was convinced that the Northern Rhône appellation of Cornas offered enormous and, at the time, unrecognized potential for producing super-quality Syrah wines.

M. Chapoutier 2008 "La Bernadine" Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Rhône 115

"The wine was born from heaven & earth...of love." For generations in Rhône Valley, the Chapoutier family has been producing great wines biodynamically to respect the terroir. Their aim is to always convey the same love of wine, and to give people a chance to discover its diversity. All their labels are also in Braille since 1996.

Trincherro 2008 "Central Park West Vineyard" Petit Verdot Napa 119

Petit Verdot originated in Bordeaux and is used sparingly in blends to add structure due to late ripening from the climate. Now, in Northern California & Australia with more temperate temperature, it produces wines that are spicy, rich in color, high in tannins & alcohol. This vineyard, named in a nostalgic nod to the New York City origins of the Trincherro family, is located at the southern end of the St. Helena appellation.

Magdalena Toso "40" 2005 "Las Barrancas" Red Blend Argentina 175

While honing his skills of winemaking at Opus One, Paul Hobbs had learned to make exciting, structured wines that are rooted in classic old world techniques, yet distinctly Californian in their expression. His thrill of helping spark an Argentine winemaking revolution has brought worldwide attention and prestige to the region. This wine is the result of a shared dream between Paul Hobbs and Roland Luppino, using the best selection of 40 best oak barrels of Malbec.

Bertani 2003 Amarone Veneto 218

Amarone – the name means big, bitter one – is a rich Italian red wine made from partially dried Corvina, Rondinella and Molinara grapes spread on bamboo mats creating an opulent, full bodied wine with high alcohol content. For generations, the soul of Bertani wine has been learning from tradition, and making sure that Bertani remains part of the history of the Verona area and of the culture of wine.

Penfolds 2004, 2005 "Grange" Shiraz South Australia 599

Long been considered Australia's First Growth! Shiraz at its best blended with a little Cabernet Sauvignon. Silky, seductive yet structured. How about a steak with this?
